Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost September 14, 2025

HOLY CROSS DAY INTRODUCTION

- P Holy Cross Day has been celebrated since September 14, 335, the date on which the Church of the Holy Sepulcher was dedicated. Unlike the somberness as we remember the cross on Good Friday, Holy Cross Day is
 - remember the cross on Good Friday, Holy Cross Day is much more celebratory and emphasizes the victory over sin, death, and Satan that was accomplished once and for all when Jesus was lifted up on the cross.
- Far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.

 Galatians 6:14a
- P While the world largely still sees the cross of Christ as a stumbling block or as folly, today is the day we celebrate the cross of Christ as the power of God and the wisdom of God.
- For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

 1 Corinthians 1:18
- P In the cross, the power of sin in our lives is overcome by the self-sacrificing love of God in Jesus. In the cross we witness the fulfillment of God's promise to redeem the world—the wisdom of His plan of salvation.
